Our annual snowshoe meeting at Northfield Mountain was held on June 10th. Our purpose is to begin work on the next season's schedule, verify who is still agreeable to direct events, as well as always being on the lookout for new ideas. Attending, in addition to myself, were:

I was happy to acknowledge that there were five Gold Medal winners from the 2007 USSSA Championship present in this group, as well as a National Team Member.

Jeff and Laura Clark are looking at a busy winter, as they hope to provide no less than four Saratoga Area races in 2007. First up, the success of May's Mudslinger 5-mile trail race has encouraged the Clark's to hold a winter version on the same route, aptly named the Slush-Slinger. This will be a Sunday in January, most likely the 21^{st} .

The weekend of February 3rd and 4th will be the Great Northeast Two Day Snowshoe Championship, combining times from Northfield Mountain and Saratoga Spa Winterfest. On Saturday, Northfield will be at the 10km distance (same basic route as the June 10th trail race including the viewing platform), and Saratoga Spa Winterfest will be the insanely fast 5km on Sunday. Additionally, Winterfest will hold a relay race for interested individuals and teams.

The following weekend will be the New Hampshire Two Day Snowshoe Championship, with Saturday being the 4.5-mile Sidehiller and Sunday being the 5km Frosty's Dash.

Additionally, mention of a half-marathon snowshoe race came up and Jeff Clark mentioned to look for one on the Camp Saratoga Course sometime in March, weather permitting. Bob Dion mentioned the old Moby Dick Marathon route, which could be anything from half to full marathon. We hope to be able to come up with something this winter.

As far as USSSA Regional Qualifiers go, Jeff and Laura have expressed interest for Camp Saratoga to serve in that capacity. Dave Dunham has been approached for Northfield to again serve as a qualifier, with Dave still unsure. It was pointed out that if Northfield withdrew from being a qualifier, it could be difficult for those in much of Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Maine and Connecticut to perhaps get to a qualifier with only potentially Camp Saratoga as a candidate. Rich Bolt added that the qualifier status at Northfield really increased the level of competition through the years, and that it has a tradition of being a USSSA qualifier. We will hold on to see what decision Dave comes up with. Zeke Zucker also plans on trying to gain Qualifier status for his Northern Vermont Challenge in Jefferson, Vermont. Zeke sent us an email informing that he would really try to make his event extra special for those traveling to it this coming season!

Josh Merlis of the Albany Running Exchange emailed about Brave the Blizzard, thinking they would possibly wait for a predicted snowstorm before announcing the race. The one date that may be open for them is February 11th (same as Frosty's). While we certainly have tried to discourage same day events, the distance between these two might have to allow us to try it in 2007.

Bob and Denise Dion agreed to provide our series and races with loaner snowshoes again for 2007. This is, once again, fantastic news. Bob mentioned that he may be limited to 20 or 30 pair at each event, so as we get close to snowshoe season get in touch with the Dion's if you believe your race may have a need for additional shoes.

Bob Dion stated that he thought the National Championship at Bolton Valley was exceptional in all aspects, including the relay race the second day. Bob had nice things to say about the venue, the course and the organization. Ed Alibozek seconded that he had a really great time attending also.

Ed Alibozek reported that he, Ed Jr and Paul Hartwig have plans to hold events at Hallockville Pond, the Thunderbolt (like Curly's fill in last year), as well as Florida Mountain. They have no dates for these as Ed plans on working with the state of Masschusetts DCF to get an open permit allowing us to use these locations as fill-ins or last minute replacements due to poor conditions elsewhere. Florida Mountain would not need permits as it is private property, but some work needs to be finished on a trail system there.

Walt Kolodzinski mentioned having a mid-week continuing 5km snowshoe race in the evenings at the Holyoke reservoir. Ed thought it a fantastic idea and this looks like a go providing the weather cooperates. Jeff and Laura Clark are lucky in that Camp Saratoga already has a mid-week "fun run" going on.

We were all treated to a look at Dave Dunham's newly published book about the History of Mt Washington Road Race, congratulations Dave!

We also were able to say goodbye to Rich Bolt, who has been snowshoeing with us for a long while (see SnoNews 4.7). Rich will be keeping the spirit of our snowshoeing alive in the Northwest, and has already met up with Robert Yerex also of Oregon (who attended the 2007 Bolton Valley Championship). It looks like we are infiltrating nicely throughout the country as we sent Kelly Herrington to Washington state last year! Rich said he would be back to do a couple races in our series next season regardless. It will be nice to continue seeing him.

WMAC SNOWSHOE SERIES SCORING 2007

The 2007 WMAC Snowshoe Series will utilize the same system of scoring as last season. The scoring will be decided by points as follows:

Points will be awarded to all finishers, based on number of participants in each individual race, with 1st place always receiving 100 points, regardless of number of finishers. Each subsequent position will be awarded points on a sliding scale from 100.

Example; if 40 people complete Woodford, the overall winner will receive 100 points. The person in second will receive 97.5 points, third will get 95 points, on and on until the last finisher gets awarded the factor point. This will weight the scoring by number of participants.

If at the next event, Merrimack, there are 20 finishers, first place again gets 100 points, second 95, third 90 etc.

If there isn't snow at an event, a foot race may be held instead. The points awarded for a "non-snowshoe" race will be halved. So, if there is no snow at Race X, and 50 people participate, first place gets 50 points, second receives 49 points, etc. This way, the event (and the directors efforts) can be salvaged towards being part of the series, with lesser weight than a traditional snowshoe race.

The overall male / female WMAC Snowshoe Champions will be decided by total number of points for their best six out of ???? possible scores at the WMAC events.

Also, the top point producers in five year age categories, both men and women, will be declared age group champions. You must complete at least four of the events to be eligible for an age group title, with your best six scores counting.
